Title: Finance and WE in Scotland

Proposed by: WE Edinburgh Branch

Proposer: Charlotte Gilbert Seconder: Maddy Millar

Type of motion: Business motion

Motion text:

- 1. WE commits to devoting an appropriate proportion of its funds and resources to Scottish issues and to Scottish Parliament-facing action that falls within the WE aims.
- That appropriate proportion shall be decided by reference to the level of devolution and the relative population sizes of Scotland and of the rest of GB using a method similar to that already applied by the UK Government, wherein resources are allocated according to population size (as per the Barnett formula).

Motion rationale:

- 7 Currently WE tends to devote resources and create policy initiatives by reference to what WE wants
- 8 the UK Government at Westminster to do, and then look to make them applicable to Scotland by
- 9 minor modification. This is not appropriate given that the existing Scottish Government position on
- many of the issues concerned is already substantially different to the UK Government's.
- 11 That is important to WE because of:
- 12 a. The unique position of Scotland as the most devolved nation in the UK, with its own Legal
- System, and a Scottish Parliament which has control in Scotland of many of the issues that
- concern WE, from childcare and education to VAWG and abortion;
- b. The concomitant differences from England and Wales in Parliament-facing action and on the
- pressure that the Party can best apply in Scotland to achieve WE aims;

- 17 c. The fact that actions taken to further WE aims by the Scottish Parliament can be used as strong levers to then promote the same actions in other UK Parliaments;
- d. The fact that the Scottish Parliament is and always has been of a political makeup that means it is more amenable to taking such actions.
- e. Furthermore, equal representation is one of the party's seven core objectives⁽¹⁾, therefore it seems prudent that Scotland has access to a representative amount of the finance available from central office.
- As taxation income is devolved to Scottish parliament using a population-based formula⁽²⁾, this motion
- 25 suggests that in practice the Steering Committee applies a similar rationale to WE finances. This
- money would help to run a candidate in upcoming elections and a fundraising event for the branch to
- recruit more members, as well as allowing us to tackle more/bigger campaigns.
- The Edinburgh branch has a core team of 8 volunteers who run the branch. Most members are
- 29 balancing their own studying, jobs and caring commitments to help within the branch. We are
- 30 volunteers, and not only do we not get paid but we also pay our own money each month to be
- volunteers as do all of our WE sisters. As Scotland is currently receiving little to none of the finance
- from central office, this seems an unfair deal! Only recently, we had to pass up on the campaign of
- police misogyny in Scotland as we did not have enough members or resources to help tackle such a
- large and systemically rooted issue. It is worth mentioning here that policing is devolved in Scotland.
- Note: 'GB' is used above when referring to the proportion of the UK that WE currently operate in, since WE is not currently registered as a Political Party in Northern Ireland.
