Motion text:

- 1 Conference:
- Notes that Policy Committee elections were paused in 2021
- Acknowledges that continuing without a fully functional policy team will be detrimental to the
 party
- Resolves to form a new streamlined policy group.
- 6 Modify articles 4.4, 4.8.3, 4.11.1, 7.5.9, 8.2:
- 7 ...Policy Committee Representatives
- 8 Modify article 7.1.1:
- 9 The Leader... is responsible for developing and articulating the Party's vision and strategy in
- consultation with the Steering Committee, the Policy Committee Party Conference and the
- 11 Executive Committee.

- Modify article 7.5.10:
- 13 The Steering Committee shall approve the manifestos and policy proposals by the Policy Committee
- 14 between party conferences
- 15 Replace article 7.6 with the following:
- 16 '7.6 Policy Representatives
- 7.6.1 There will be six policy representatives responsible for developing party policy, serving two
- 18 year terms beginning at Conference:
- 19 i) Four elected by a simple majority vote at Conference;
- 20 ii) One by rolling appointment* from branches that meet all requirements subject to article 7.8 below, in discussion with the Steering Committee;
- 22 iii) One by rolling appointment from official party caucuses, in discussion with the Steering Committee.
- 7.6.2 Policy representatives will develop party policy, in discussion with Central Office, the Steering
- Committee and the Leader, for approval by conference. Representatives will be required to:
- 26 i) Attend a group induction;
- 27 ii) Attend biannual meetings;
- 28 iii) Work with members, branches and caucuses to support the development of party policy.
- 7.6.3 Representatives who fail to meet the requirements above for six months, without an exemption
- agreed by the SC, will be automatically removed.
- 7.6.4 In the event of mid-term vacancies, policy representatives may be appointed by the SC until
- 32 the next conference.
- 7.6.5 Policy Representatives will elect a Chair by a simple majority vote, who shall convene their
- 34 meetings.'

Motion rationale:

- In the face of an unprecedented cost of living crisis, and in the face of the global rise of the far right
- it is more important than ever that our party leads the way in reimagining politics with innovative and
- impactful policy. This motion aims to streamline the Women's Equality Party Policy group to ensure
- that it is able to represent member voices and to deliver for women.
- 39 It is important to have a fully functional group within the party to focus on policy that is accountable to
- members, and committed to engaging with the membership on policy development. The new policy
- group will have the sole objective of developing ambitious policy to further women's equality for
- approval by members. They will agree their priorities in conversation with Central Office, the Party

- Leader and the Steering Committee and will be empowered to work with members, branches,
- 44 caucuses and experts.
- The previous iteration of the policy committee achieved a lot for the movement, but had a broad
- remit that could be difficult to prioritise and this meant it wasn't always able to deliver on its
- objectives. Drawing on lessons learned over the last seven years, the proposed group's remit will be
- much narrower. This is to ensure: that the workload is reasonable and manageable for volunteers,
- particularly those with caring responsibilities; and that the group has a laser-like focus on delivering
- 50 radical policy motions for our members and our movement. Individual policy representatives will not
- be responsible for specific policy areas, as such the group will be able to work together to respond
- to political and social developments and to work as a team on high quality, long-term policy
- 53 development for approval by conference, or the steering committee between conferences.
- 54 The representatives will be required to consult with the Party Leader, Members, Branches and
- 55 Caucuses in the development of policy. The group will consist of four directly elected members, a
- representative from a randomly selected branch (rolling appointment), and a representative from one
- of the party's caucuses to ensure representation from across our movement.
- The central policy-making engine of this party will always be Conference and our membership, but
- 59 policy representatives will be able to supplement member input by supporting in-depth policy
- development, ensuring we have all the support we need to reimagine politics.

- Note: *A rolling appointment is defined as an individual democratically selected by a branch or caucus
- membership to represent their interests, in discussion with Steering Committee. A different branch or caucus,
- in an order that is randomly selected, will have the opportunity to appoint a representative each term.
