Title: Gender self ID and single sex spaces

Proposed by: Mandu Reid, Leader of the Women's Equality Party

Type of motion: Policy motion

Motion text:

- 1 The Women's Equality Party reaffirms its commitment to being an inclusive movement and to
- 2 fighting for the liberation of all women, including trans women.
- 3 WE supports the right of transgender people to self determine their gender and to obtain gender
- 4 recognition certificates, including recognition for non-binary people, on that basis.
- 5 WE also reaffirms its support for services such as domestic abuse refuges to provide single-sex
- 6 spaces as allowed by exemptions under the Equality Act, 3 as long as they do so lawfully.
- 7 Further to this, the Women's Equality Party reaffirms its commitment to ensuring sustainable and
- 8 sufficient funding for specialist support services to ensure that all women are able to access specialist
- 9 services when they need them.

Motion rationale:

- 10 The Women's Equality Party was founded to fight for all women, including trans women. We are
- committed to being an inclusive party and to resisting the growing division in the feminist movement.
- 12 In the last year hate crime against transgender people has increased by over 50%. It is now more
- important than ever to stand with our transgender sisters and fight back against hatred and
- 14 discrimination in all forms.
- 15 Currently transgender people must receive a medical diagnosis by a specialist and one other doctor,
- obtain a detailed medical report, prove they have lived 'in role' of their 'acquired gender' for two years

- and to navigate a costly and complex bureaucracy in order to legally transition their gender. This is
- dehumanising, stigmatising and intrusive.
- 19 We recognise the concern about the impact that these changes could have on single-sex spaces, and
- therefore also reaffirm our support for the principle of providing single-sex services when necessary,
- which is lawful under the Equality Act.
- The recommendations of the Women's Equality Party's members assembly did not find significant
- 23 conflict between the party's existing policies and gender self ID, beyond the need to uphold single-
- 24 sex spaces lawfully in the EVAWG sector.¹
- 25 Fundamentally we do not believe that gender self ID has to be at odds with the protections that women
- have fought so hard for. The single biggest threat to women's services and women's spaces is one
- of funding. Therefore, the party reaffirms its ongoing support for sustainable and sufficient funding to
- the women's sector and EVAWG services, including trans-led, and single-sex provision, and all other
- 29 specialist services, ensuring that every woman can get the support they need.

Note: EVAWG = Ending Violence Against Women and Girls
