Title of motion you wish to amend: Reforming Policy Committee

#### Motion text you wish to amend:

Lines 17-23.

- "17 7.6.1 There will be six policy representatives responsible for developing party policy, serving two 18 year terms beginning at Conference:
- 19 i) Four elected by a simple majority vote at Conference;
- 20 ii) One by rolling appointment\* from branches that meet all requirements subject to article 7.8 21 below, in discussion with the Steering Committee;
- 22 iii) One by rolling appointment from official party caucuses, in discussion with the Steering 23 Committee."

## Wording of amendment:

- 1 7.6.1 There will be six eight policy representatives responsible for developing party policy, serving
- 2 two year terms beginning at Conference:
- 3 i) Four elected by a simple majority vote at Conference;
- 4 ii) One by rolling appointment\* from branches that meet all requirements subject to article 7.8 below,
- 5 in discussion with the Steering Committee;

- 6 iii) One by rolling appointment from official party caucuses, in discussion with the
- 7 Steering Committee
- 8 <u>iv) One appointed by WE Branches in Scotland, in discussion with the Steering Committee.</u>
- 9 v) One appointed by WE Branches in Wales, in discussion with the Steering Committee.

#### **Amendment rationale**

- 10 The very first Business Motion passed at the first WEP conference stated that all WEP policies should
- take account of the different legislative context of Scotland and be 'Scotland proof'<sup>1</sup>. This has always
- been enacted through 2 Scottish Policy Representatives on the Policy Committee. In 2020 two elected
- 13 Welsh Representatives were added to the Policy Committee<sup>2</sup>, in recognition of WEP's commitment to
- 14 cover all UK jurisdictions, and to engage in policy learning across different nations in the UK to
- improve women's equality.
- 16 The Scottish and Welsh Parliaments have significant devolved powers to pass legislation in health,
- social care, education, housing, policing and the courts, and other areas which have an impact on
- women's equality. They also elect members by proportional representation, which means that smaller
- 19 parties like WEP have a much better chance of being elected there than to the Westminster
- 20 Parliament (which uses First Past The Post, shutting out smaller parties).
- 21 We welcome the reformation of the Policy Committee, and believe that including Scottish and Welsh
- 22 representation will enhance WEP's reputation as a party relevant for the whole of the UK. This
- would enable valuable policy development opportunities from Scotland and Wales where there are
- examples of politics being done differently. It will also engage members across the devolved nations
- and give them a voice in the WEP policy making process.
