# Amendment title: Amendment to limited consecutive terms of office for Scottish representation on the Steering Committee 

Proposed by: WE's Steering Committee

## Type of amendment: Amendment to business motion

Title of motion you wish to amend: Scottish representation on the Steering Committee

## Motion text you wish to amend:

Line 6: Members of the Steering Committee joining under Articles 7.5 .12 (iii), (v), (vi), (vii) and (viii) above may sit on the Steering Committee for a maximum of two consecutive terms.
(N.B. Text in lilac and underlined is new text.)

## Wording of amendment:

Reinstate the deleted '(v),' to read 'Members of the Steering Committee joining under Articles 7.5.12 (iii), (v), (vi), (vii) and (viii) above may sit on the Steering Committee for a maximum of two consecutive terms.'

## Amendment rationale

Article 7.5.13 of WE's Constitution states that Members of the Steering Committee (SC) joining under various paragraphs of Article 7.5.12 may serve for a maximum of two consecutive terms.

This is so that the SC has the regular opportunity for new Members to be elected to it, giving regular influxes of fresh vision and skills along with experience and consistency, also allowing more people a chance to represent their particular interests on the SC over a period of time.

9 By asking Conference to insert a new Article 7.5.12(v) to the Constitution and then amending Article $10 \quad 7.5 .13$ to delete '(v)', WE Scotland's motion makes its representative an exception to this rule which 11 applies to hub co-ordinators who represent their local branches, as well as to all other elected SC members except the Leader, and is being amended to include Caucuses now they have been recognised as WE Caucuses and their representatives vote on the SC - if the motion carried unamended, it would allow a single WE Scotland representative to serve on the SC for an unlimited number of terms, instead of for two consecutive four-year terms.

WE's SC believes that to create this exception is unnecessary, commends this amendment to Conference, and asks Conference to vote the amendment through.
