

New North Carolina Voting Rules

Vote with any of these IDs:

Address on ID **does not matter**. Age 65? Valid ID is good for life.

- NC drivers license
- NC non-driver ID
- US passport
- US military or Veteran ID
- Tribal ID
- NC student ID*
- NC government employee ID*
- Free ID from county board of elections
- Out-of-state driver license (valid for 90 days after voter registration)*

Don't have ID? You can vote! Ask for a waiver and ballot.

**Mar. 3, 2020
Primary Day**

Vote for the candidates you want to see on your Election Day ballot.

**United States
Census 2020**

The US Census is held every ten years. Count all of the members of your household.

**Nov. 3, 2020
Election Day**

Vote for President, US Congress, NC Senate, NC Governor, state and local elections.

YOU MUST BE REGISTERED TO VOTE

Who Can Register?



NC citizens who will be 18 by Election Day. NC citizens who have completed the terms of a felony sentence. NC citizens who are 16 & 17 may pre-register.

3 Ways To Vote:

Early Voting: Vote at any early voting site in your county: youcanvote.org/voting

Election Day: You must vote at your assigned polling place: youcanvote.org/lookup

By Mail: Request an absentee ballot with this form: youcanvote.org/mail

Moving?

Permanent move: You must update your registration.

Temporary move: You can choose to register where you currently live, return home to vote **or** request an absentee ballot.
